The IJAB project VISION:INKLUSION seeks to answer that question. Representatives of the IYW community, disability community organisations, disability charities, researchers and administrators are working together to develop an inclusion strategy for IYW by the end of 2017.

Over the last few years, IJAB and other stakeholders have begun to develop approaches to enable young people with a disability to participate in international youth work and non-formal education activities and generally to make international youth work more inclusive. VISION:INKLUSION consolidates the experiences gathered in the process, and contributes an international perspective. At the same time, the project creates synergy for the entire community.VISION:INKLUSION is based on the three dimensions of the Index for Inclusion
